The Singapore International Math Olympiad Challenge ("SIMOC") conducted on 21 July 2024 in Singapore with the approximately 2,300 candidates from around the globe, including Cambodia, Azerbaijan, Turkey, Indonesia, India, Laos, Mexico, Mongolia, New Zealand, Pakistan, Malaysia, Jordan, New Zealand, Myanmar, Kazakhstan, Nigeria, Philippines, Ghana, Thailand, Uzbekistan, Brazil, Iran, Japan, UAE Dubai, Kyrgyzstan, China, Canada, Vietnam, Mauritius and Sri Lanka.

SISC also sent 16 students to represent the school, and Cambodia as a whole, to participate in this prestigious event, earning 18 medals, including Gold, Silver and Bronze. It is a testimonial that SISC students have been equipped well with mathematical skills and problem-solving abilities.

We, in the SISC Community, are very excited and proud of our students for their excellent achievements. At the beginning of each new academic year, we get so many questions from our parents. They ask if their child has eaten, did they sleep enough, did they cry, and so forth. These questions are very normal from our parents who just want to know how their children are behaving and transitioning at school. Our EY teachers are always honest and transparent when communicating with parents, updating them on their child's progress. This is an important part of building a trust relationship between parents and the school!









As the year progresses, concerns start to shift to the child's academic progress, as parents worry whether or not their child is learning well. Are they advancing in their reading and writing and numeracy skills? It is important for parents to remember that at such a young age, children learn and develop at their own pace, in small steps, every day. For children that are so young, progress is measured by every little milestone that they achieve, outside of just academics. Were they able to finish their snack all by themselves? Did they share their toys nicely? Were they able to follow instructions? Do they recognise their name when they see it written? All of these things are signs of progress!

At SISC, we work together as a community to evaluate and monitor the progress of all of our children. We work hard to implement the best foundation that we can, making sure that our Early Years students are ready for their academic journey into the higher year levels.
