Independence is not something that we can teach. We have to give opportunities for our children to practice this skill. By viewing independence as a skill to be practised, healthy development is more likely to occur.

Working with our families in partnership is an important initiative – when we work together, we deliver the same message to our children, contributing to their success.


#### Trigonometry in Action: Grade 10 Students Take Learning Outdoors

Who says that Maths isn't fun? Our Year 11 students at SISC have proven otherwise! Students took their trigonometry lesson outside of the classroom for a hands-on experience, stepping beyond textbooks and past papers to apply their knowledge in real-world settings.

Armed with improvised clinometers, meter sticks, calculators, and their newfound skills, students visited different stations to measure the heights of tall objects such as buildings, trees, and flagpoles. They used trigonometric ratios, angles of elevation and depression, and collaboratively verified their measurements during this active learning experience that extended beyond SOH-CAH-TOA.

Each group member took on roles, from clinometer operator to measurer and verifier, which promoted teamwork and collaborative learning. The task made trigonometry more meaningful to students by demonstrating the real-world applications of Mathematics.
